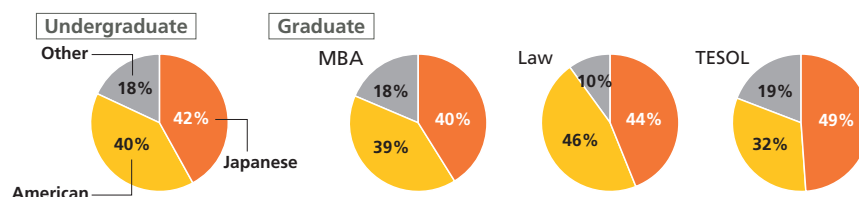

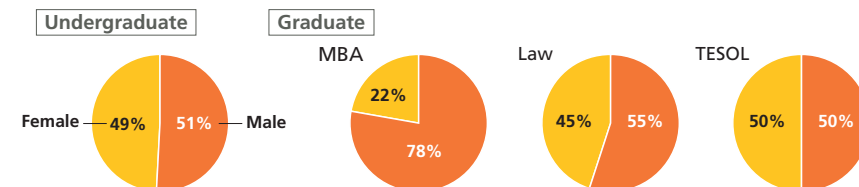

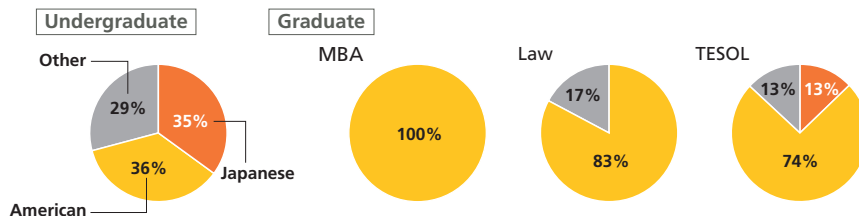
Students by Nationality (over 60 different nationalities)
