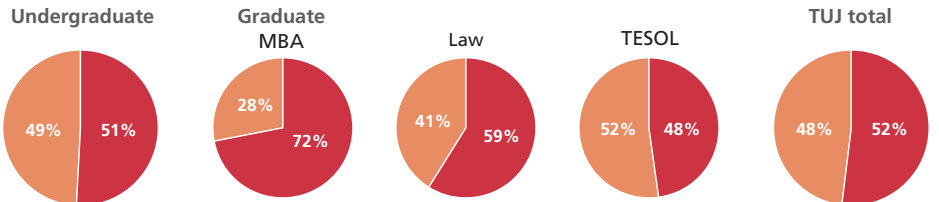

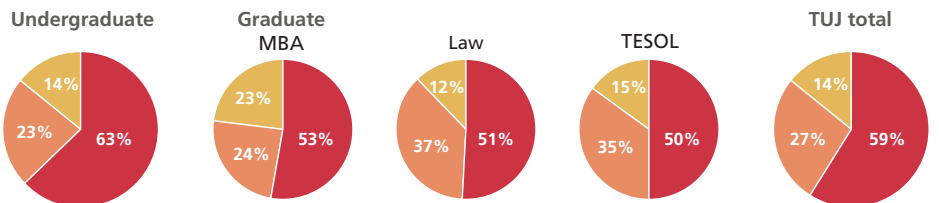
▶ STUDENT BODY BY GENDER AND NATIONALITY (Degree programs only)

< GENDER > ● Male ● Female



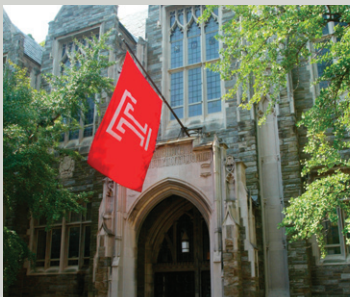
< NATIONALITY > ● Japanese ● American ● Other
